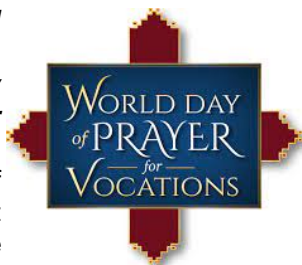

The Shape of Parish: As we prepare for returning to public worship, Fr. Paddy would like to offer an opportunity for parishioners to engage about what it might mean to come back to Mass, and what effects the Covid pandemic might have as we go forward. Creativity and flexibility will be needed, in consultation, to reshape structures to best serve the pastoral needs of our communities, taking into account the reducing Mass-going population and the reducing number of priests. Measures to renew our parishes as centres of evangelisation and faith formation, will pose both challenges and opportunities. 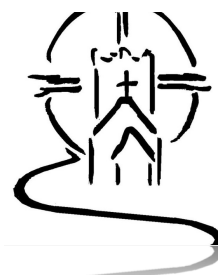

Sunday Thought: We continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection.

Today's reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is the event being recounted by the disciples in the opening verse of today's Gospel. Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets his disciples with the words,

"Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting.

The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well.

Peace is what they need more than anything else. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with another gift—forgiveness. In today's Gospel, this connection is made in the final verses.
